The choice of optional subjects is from a prescribed list, including disciplines like Agriculture, Agricultural Engineering, Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Science, Botany, Chemistry, Civil Engineering, Forestry, Geology, Mathematics, Mechanical Engineering, Physics, Statistics, and Zoology.
